A basic income is

- sufficient to live on and participate in society,
- granted to all individuals,
- without means test
- or work requirement.

## benefits: nature

We need to consume less to save nature.

consume less → people loose jobs → no income!

## benefits: freedom

Freedom to do the things I want to do.

Maybe more important:

Freedom to not being forced to do things I do not want to do.

Freedom to speech.

## more benefits

- no need for big pension funds
- work, study, work, study, work, study
- services become cheaper
- education becomes cheaper!
- time for charity work
